### 1. Ensuring EU Policies Deliver Results

#### A. Closer Cooperation with Member States

- •Increased support for Member States to ensure proper implementation of EU laws.
- •Implementation strategies to facilitate the transposition of EU regulations.



### B. Strengthening Administrative Capacity, Digital Tools, and Data

- •Investments in digitalization and administrative capacity to reduce complexity.
- •Enhanced monitoring tools to ensure compliance.

#### C. More Effective Stakeholder Engagement

- •Each Commissioner will host <u>two annual</u> <u>dialogues with stakeholders</u> to track policy implementation.
- •Regular feedback mechanisms to improve policy effectiveness

### **D. Swift and Resolute Enforcement Action**

- •Continuous monitoring to ensure compliance.
- •Fast-track infringement procedures when necessary.



### 2. Making Europe Simpler and Faster

### A. New Targets to Reduce Administrative Burdens

•25% reduction in overall administrative costs (35% for SMEs).
•Estimated savings of €37.5 billion by 2029.

## C. Gradual Stress-Testing of EU Legislation

•Systematic review of existing laws to eliminate inefficiencies and reduce costs.

The road to the next multiannual financial framework (COM 2025/46 def)

# D. A Simpler, More Focused, and Impactful EU Budget

•Reducing bureaucracy in EU funding programs for faster and more effective implementation.

### B. Prioritizing Simplification Measures

Focus on key areas such as sustainability, investment, digital policies, and the
 Common Agricultural Policy.
 Omnibus packages to streamline various regulatory requirements.

### E. Conducting Reality Checks

 Engaging directly with businesses, particularly SMEs, to assess regulatory impact.



### 3. Improving How to Make New Rules

### A. Reinforced SME and Competitiveness Checks

•Systematic evaluation of the impact of new laws on SMEs and key economic sectors.

## B. Scrutiny of Delegated and Implementing Acts

•Enhanced oversight to ensure secondary legislation remains cost-effective and efficient.

### C. Smart and Digital-Ready Legislation

- •Ensuring laws are designed for digital implementation from the outset.
- •Expanding the use of digital tools to reduce compliance costs.

## D. Assessing the Impact of Significant Amendments

•A new methodology for evaluating legislative changes to prevent unnecessary burdens.



# 4. The Way Forward: Partnership and Shared Responsibility

## A. Regular Progress Reporting for Transparency and Accountability

- •Annual reports from each
  Commissioner on policy
  implementation and enforcement.
  - •Public dashboards to track simplification efforts.

### B. Engaging with EU Legislators for Better Rules

- •Closer collaboration with the European Parliament and the Council to ensure laws remain simple and effective.
- •Calls for legislative bodies to assess the impact of amendments on regulatory costs



by <u>renewing</u> the Interinstitutional Agreement on «Better Lawmaking» to clarify how best to achieve these goals.
